#### Christmas: The Closeness of God A Message From Fr. Brian MacDougall

## **An Inspirational Evening with Senator Brian Francis on Truth and Reconciliation**

On November, 4<sup>th</sup>, our St. Francis of Assisi CWL was honoured to have Senator Brian Francis speak to a full church (abiding by COVID guidelines) with 84 people in attendance. Our church capacity at present is 85.

He talked for an hour about Residential Schools in general and his own personal experience attending an "Indian Day School" here in PEI. He spoke about the government's decision to remove Indigenous children from their homes and families and place them in residential schools, where they were often taught by either nuns, priests, or ministers. These children had no contact with family for years.

Some of them were as young as four years old when they were taken from their homes. They lived together, boys being separated from girls and siblings separated from each other. Many were abused, physically, emotionally, sexually. Sadly they often grew up without being shown any love, tenderness, or compassion. Hence, when they became adults and had children of their own, they found it difficult to parent. Senator Brian talked about the lasting effects that generations have suffered, and continue to suffer today, because of the trauma and abuse that were experienced at these schools. He said that, though it was likely difficult for those in attendance to hear the facts about what had happened to his Indigenous brothers and sisters, it was also very difficult for him to talk about it.

Those who attended the session are still reflecting on what an informative, educational, and powerful session it was. I think that we all admired Senator Francis for having the courage and wisdom to help educate and enlighten everyone on what really took place in Residential and Day Schools.



In keeping with our theme of "Caring for our Common Home", with an emphasis on water use and the provision of clean water to all, the members of our council at Holy Redeemer Parish raised funds to help provide clean drinking water to a community in Kenya. With the help of "Farmers Helping Farmers Inc.," and Global Affairs Canada, our funds were used to help purchase and install a 5,000 liter water tank for the family of Hellen Makena Rigiri who lives in Timau (near Meru), Kenya. This tank was installed in January of 2020 and collects and stores rain water. The members of the family now do not have to transport water on their backs, can use stored water in dry spells for growing vegetables, and have clean water at all times for drinking,

cooking and washing.
